- 7. REPORT FROM AIR POLLUTION CONTROL OFFICER Richard Stedman, APCO, reported on the following:

Advisory Committee

The Advisory Committee has not met since our last board meeting.

Engineering and Compliance

- In July 2023, EPA published a final rule to remove the Title V emergency affirmative defense provisions from state operating permit programs. This action requires MBARD to update our Title V federal operating permit Rule 218 to be consistent with EPA's rule. The revisions to Rule 218 will go out to the public for review this summer and come to the Board for adoption at the August meeting.
- On June 3, the Hearing Board approved a variance for UC Santa Cruz to operate a natural gas emergency generator while changing out a transformer during a planned power outage.
- We are working with an attorney, Matt Maclear, to take the next steps of legal action for the gas station in Marina operating without a permit. This initially went to our Hearing Board for an abatement order which was not successful in achieving

compliance. On June 7, 2024, the case was filed with the Monterey County Superior Court.

 No odor complaints have been received from Marina residents since the April Board meeting.

Planning and Air Monitoring

- Just as the Spare the Air wood heating season ended, fire season began. We are tracking several fires and smoke impacts from northern California experienced in our tricounty area.
- Since the November 2023 start of the Wood Stove Change Out Program MBARD has awarded \$134K toward incentives for the purchase of new, more efficient, and EPA-compliant wood-burning stoves. The majority of the incentives have been for purchases in the San Lorenzo Valley, a smoke-sensitive area. This will help reduce smoke impacts from wood burning for home heating.
- With the ZERO EMISSION SCHOOL BUS PROGRAM MBARD has helped provide two electric school buses that were recently delivered to:
 - Santa Cruz City Schools
 - San Benito High School District
- Since the November 2023 start of the LEEP Program MBARD has awarded \$36K for residential and \$81K for commercial incentives for the replacement of gas engine-powered landscape equipment for the exchange of cleaner, electric equipment.
- AB 2766 Grant Program application deadline has been extended until August 2nd.
- MBARD is moving forward with an opportunity to work with Morgan State University and NASA for a three-year project involving pollutant data collected from the MBARD Clarity Sensor Network. NASA researchers will review PM_{2.5}, PM₁₀, and NO₂ data collected by the sensors. This data will then be used to compare data collected from NASA satellite remote sensing and further analysis from global air quality models. The goal of the project is to enhance the utility of air pollution sensor technology and create protocols and tools to establish a calibration framework for sensors and sensor manufacturers. This data will also be shared with EPA for their knowledge and research in establishing future sensor technology for data collection regulations. This is an exciting opportunity for MBARD to help with the evolution of sensor technology to improve their reliability and for their use in air pollution regulatory monitoring
- There has been approximately 673 acres of prescribed burning in the jurisdiction from the start of 2024 until June 18.



Clean Air Act (CAA) Revisions

- August 12, 2015 EPA rescinded a portion of its 2010 Title V Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Tailoring Rule which established the Title V major source permitting threshold for GHG at 100,000 tons per year.
- U.S. Supreme Court ruled in June 2014 that the CAA conception of "major" source did not encompass GHG emissions. Therefore, GHG emissions alone cannot make a facility a "major" source.
- October 18, 2016 EPA finalized revisions to modernize the public notice rule provisions in the CAA permitting programs to allow for electronic noticing (e-noticing) in lieu of newspaper noticing.

Clean Air Act (CAA) Revisions (cont)

- July 12, 2023 EPA finalized the removal of emergency affirmative defense provisions from the CAA operating permit program regulations.
- > These provisions state that an emergency arising from unforeseeable events can constitute affirmative defense for non-compliance with technologybased permit conditions.
- > U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C Circuit issued a 2014 decision, concluding emergency affirmative defense exceeds EPA's statutory authority
- > Local permitting authorities must submit program revisions to EPA to remove Title V emergency affirmative defense provisions.



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
Clean Air Act Part 70 Program

- Title V program is a requirement of the federal Clean Air Act (CAA) that regulates air emissions from stationary sources.
- Title V requires Major Sources of air pollutants, and certain other sources to obtain and operate in compliance with a federal operating permit.
- Applicable requirements of the federal Title V permit are codified in 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 70 for local permitting authorities.
- MBARD delegated by EPA to implement Title V program in November 2001. EPA-approved Title V program is contained in MBARD Rule 218 (Title V: Federal Operating Permits).



Changes to Address GHGs

- Revisions to definition of "Major Source" to remove sources that emit 100,000 tons per year or more of Carbon Dioxide Equivalent (CO_{2e}) GHG emissions.
- Addition of definition: "Subject to Regulation"
 - GHGs only subject to regulation if facility is a Major Source and CO_{2e} GHG emissions have the potential to equal or exceed 100,000 tons per year.
- Removal of definitions: "Carbon Dioxide Equivalent Emissions (CO2)" & "Greenhouse Gases (GHGs)*
- Revisions and removal of GHG Exemptions, Section 1.3.2, emit less than:





Changes to Public Notification

- Remove mandatory requirement to provide public notice through publication in one newspaper.
- · Update rule to allow for:
- Publication in one newspaper, or
- > Posting notice for entire 30 days on MBARD website; and,
- Email distribution to interested parties who are subscribed on MBARD's list.

 - Ensures Rule 218 conforms with EPA's Title V operating permit program regulation based on the prior court decision.

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





6-7 projects- depending on bus types requested and additional funding sources leveraged

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
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



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


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
